Christmas is a time for giving.

Hurricane Helene Update:

During the first six weeks after the hurricane, the TN Baptist Disaster Relief volunteers helped mud out close to 1,000 homes, multiple tree removals, mass feeding, showers and washing clothes, and many road repairs. Our association sent a chainsaw team and delivered donations to God's Warehouse. Several of our churches have responded directly with churches in East Tennessee that they have contacts with. We will be delivering toys to Trade, TN, to help New Beginnings Church serve many families in their area.

Now the Disaster Relief efforts have moved from the recovery period to the rebuild period. Tennessee Baptist's formed the Arise and Build Task force to make plans for rebuilding in East Tennessee. Their theme is from Nehimiah 2:18, *"Let us rise up and build. Then they set their hands to this good work."*

"More than 1,500 families in East TN were devastated by the floods generated by Hurricane Helene in late September. Over 500 families had their homes completely destroyed. Tennessee Baptists have committed to build at least 40 new homes and repair as many others as possible. In collaboration with Appalachian Service Project (ASP), these homeowners will be vetted to ensure their true needs are met. To the extent possible, we want TBC churches to adopt these families and be with them through the entire process. Ideally, a church will adopt a family and contribute the cost of their new home (\$25,000) or adopt a family and contribute the estimated cost of materials for their repair."

Is our association ready to give? We are committing to adopting a family to help them get back into a home. This means that our churches will need to raise \$25,000. The good news is that we already have \$10,000 of this goal. We will need volunteers to go and help in the building process as that time will be scheduled.

So, during this Christmas season of giving think about ways that you and your church can be involved in helping to adopt a family in East Tennessee. How will you "set your hands to this good work?" Your church could receive an offering, a Sunday School Class or Small Group could adopt a room to refurnish, and volunteers will be needed to provide the labor to build the house. There are many ways that you can give towards this Arise and Build Project. Let's all help this family build a new home and help to restore this part of their lives.
