"Who then is Paul, and who is Apollos, but ministers through whom you believed, as the Lord gave to each one? I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase. So then neither he who plants is anything, nor he who waters, but God who gives the increase. Now he who plants and he who waters are one, and each one will receive his own reward according to his own labor. For we are Gods fellow workers;" I Corinthians 3:5-9a

As I write this article, there are several of us preparing and packing for a mission trip to Jerome, ID to help put a new roof on Northridge Fellowship. I'm asked from time to time why we continue to do these types of short-term mission trips. Are they worth the time, money, and effort put into them? Couldn't you just send the money your team is spending to the church and let them be blessed that way? You're just doing a construction project, how is that evangelism? Isn't there plenty to do here at home?

Well, the Bible gives us the answers we need. Both Matthew 28:18-20 and Acts 1:8 is still true for us today. We are given examples throughout the New Testament of churches helping other churches and sending teams to reach others for Christ. One doesn't have to read beyond Acts to see many of these examples. Think about the sowing and reaping principle found in Scriptures.

When the association organizes a mission trip it gives mission volunteers an opportunity that they may not ordinarily have. Thank God that many of our churches organize their own mission trips. The association can offer the same missions experience for someone whose church might not be able to offer them.

Let's consider two of the mission partnerships that our association has had in the past. The first one to examine is Grandview Church in Mead, Colorado. Seven years ago, this church did not exist. I met Bruce and Lisa Headrick through our state convention and felt lead to help them as they committed to be church planters in Mead. Their need at the time was for the basement of their home to be finished to start Bible Studies and kids Bible clubs. So, our association sent teams to accomplish that. Seven years later God has established the Grandview Church. This summer the church had to cap their sports camp outreach at 250 participants! They are consistently running 110-130 in church every Sunday. Bruce is looking at fully retiring at the end of the year and is in transition with a new pastor named Ryan Singleton to accomplish this.

The second mission partnership we can evaluate is Clark Fork Fellowship in Superior, MT. The past two years our association has sent teams out to Montana to help this church with several needs. The church needed many repairs including the portico that we raised over \$11,000 to build. Our first Sunday with them our team made up more than half of those attending. They have grown since then and in July were able to baptize six new Christians!

God is faithful when we invest in His Kingdom! From these small mission seeds we have truly seen *God give the increase.*
