The month of December should always be a joyous and cheerful time of the year in our churches. After all, we are celebrating the birth of Jesus, our Lord and Savior! Our churches plan special events like those listed on page 5 of this newsletter. And our congregations get to join their voices in the singing of Christmas hymns and carols.

So, this got me to thinking about the way our churches have changed over the past few years or even decades when it comes to worshipping through singing. And I've also read a few articles about this lately. One article asked the question, "Does your church unintentionally discourage singing during services?" I'll let you answer and deal with that one for yourself, but I thought it was a stimulating question to ask.

What really prompted this article was something found in a Washington Post article. The writer discussed the benefits of church choirs and the physical and mental health benefits of singing with others. Choirs are large families, said the paper. Singing in them promotes social bonding and joy. Choir members are more optimistic, less lonely, and more likely to contribute positively to community. A sense of achievement comes from creating notes with the body and working together to master a work. The text is often inspiring and beautiful, so despite the day's travails, choir members leave rehearsals feeling "this is a very positive thing that I can be a part of." The Bible knew that all along. Choirs are a biblical part of God's scheme of worship!

In the "Sing With Us" study, research points to the physical and mental health benefits of singing with others. Sing With Us linked singing in the choir to reduced stress hormones and increased cytokines, proteins that can boost the body's ability to fight serious illness. The study went on to mention that singing has numerous health benefits for the older adults, too: fewer falls, doctor visits and prescription drugs, better social connections, and better cognitive function, according to a study sponsored by the National Endowment for the Arts.

Several of the benefits of church choirs are the social bonding they create which contributes to a sense of belonging and joy. Studies have found that group singing fosters trust, cooperation, and a sense of social cohesion (We call this fellowship!)

However, when you look at the comments from Lifeway research, the number of churches with choirs has fallen to 33%. That's troubling, say the authors of the National Congregations Study, as it means fewer lay people have a role to play in worship. "The decline of choirs is worth examining in its own right because singing in the choir is one of the most common ways, along with Bible studies, for people to become more deeply involved in a congregation, and it is the single most common way for lay people to participate actively in gathered worship," according to the study's author.

Maybe it is time that our churches reconsider the benefits and contributions of having a choir. Not every church will be able to do this and maybe a church would consider having a choir for a specific season or event. I have noticed several churches that I know are returning to the use of a choir, either for special seasons or worship times.
